Granchak T. The opportunity of Internet-issues in context of increase of the efficiency of using information

The article is coming to light the specificity of internet issue's information. It contains analysis of the role of this kind information in process of increase of the efficiency of information-analytic's activity and government.

Zabolotna N. The monuments of the South Slavonic Cyrillic book printing in the Department of Rare Books of the Vernadsky National Library of Ukraine

The article is devoted to South Slavonic, first of all Serbian, Cyrillic old-printed books at the Department of Rare Books of the Vernadsky National Library of Ukraine. South Slavonic Cyrillic old-printed books, which are preserved in the Department of Rare Books, illustrate all main stages of the South Slavonic book printing history. These are books, which were edited on the South Slavonic lands, in Venice, Roumania, Vienna and Buda (Budapest). The pre-eminent majority of the South Slavonic Cyrillic old-printed books, which are preserved in the Department, are destined to the Serbs. These books are written in Church Slavonic or in Serbian language. It is the liturgical, catechetical, philosophic-didactical and historical literature. The great attention is paid to the origin of these books from old libraries and to the most notable traits of some copies. The most important and interesting marginalia are quoted. These marginalia are not a historical and linguistical source only; they also appear the copy history and the Ukrainian-Serbian relations and contacts in the past.

Polovynchak U. Newspaper «Kievlyanin» as a source of the investigation of «Ukrainian problem» in Russian empire at the end of the XIXth – the beginning of the XXth century

The article is devoted to study of the development of Ukrainian national-liberation movement at the end of the XIXth – the beginning of the XXth century. The research is based on historical documents and publishings of newspaper «Kievlyanin». It explains the process of «Kievlyanin»'s struggle against Ukrainian political movement. The activity of «Kievlyanin» is considered in the context of its relations with Ukrainian national movement. The newspaper «Kievlyanin» at the end of the XIXth – the beginning of the XXth century supported the monarchy ideology. The role and place of newspaper «Kievlyanin» in the propaganda of official ideology of Russian empire is shown with factual material. Reactionary essence of the tsarist policy towards Ukrainian movement has been shown.

The author investigated the specificity of creation of Ukrainian theatre, education, periodicals, science on the basis of materials of press. The development of Ukrainian state-building's idea – from cultural – throw educational activity – to the requirements of independence of the state are analysed.

Moiseyenko N. Informational resources of the Library of German Bundestag

Informational resources of the Library of German Bundestag bases on modern technology and assist effective work of parliamentary groups and Bundestag Administration and others. The Library's collections mainly focus on politics, public administration, law, economics, social sciences and modern history.

The collection of official publications from abroad includes the Law Gazettes of some 60 countries as well as parliamentary publications, statistical material and other official publications, mainly from European countries and the United States. The publications of over 200 governmental and non-governmental international and supranational organizations are also catalogued and indexed. Other special features are publications from the field of higher education and a large quantity of «grey» literature, which the Library has collected from the outset. Grey literature comprises non-commercial semi-official and unofficial publications. The Library is divided into four sections: Collection Development I, Collection Development II, Indexing and Documentation, and the Information and Reference Service.

The catalogues list publications which have appeared as bibliographically independent works or as contributions to other works. The catalogue is available as a card catalogue and on microfiche. The transfer of these catalogue data covering the period up to 1986 to an on-line database is planned. Since 1987, the Library has acquired and indexed publications with the help of an electronic library system. For literature published since 1987, a user-friendly on-line catalogue, known as an open public-access catalogue, or OPAC for short, is available. In spring 2002, the Library began to set up an electronic library which has greatly increased the range of general information available to users and allows them quick access to politically interesting material directly from their offices.

Malol'etova N., Jakushko B. German scientific-research union in Bonn: its activity, structure and book exchange relations with Vernadsky National Library of Ukraine

This article aims at acquainting with the history of foundation and at providing information about the – structure and activities of the most influential self-governing organization of Germany, which seeks to promote the development of science, research programmes, international cooperation and devotes particular attention to the education and advancement of young researchers, presenting them numerous grants.

It briefly describes some of the wide range of activities concerning the DFG funding programmes.

Included in the article are explanations regarding some aspects of its activities in the sphere of librarianship (interregional and specialized libraries' acquisition of foreign scientific literature) and as the German's largest international book-exchange centre, and update information and special features of the long-termed book-exchange contacts with the Vernadsky National Library of Ukraine.
