Objectives:

To develop pupils' speaking, listening and artistic skills.

- To widen pupils' knowledge about the traditions of celebrating Thanksgiving Day in the USA.

- To develop pupils' imagination and visual memory.

- To stimulate interest for learning English.

Equipment: multimedia whiteboard, projector, laptop computer, holiday decorations.

I. Speaker 1: – Dear teachers, pupils and guests. Welcome to our party.

Scene "The Origin of Thanksgiving"

Speaker 1: – I know that Americans still celebrate Thanksgiving Day in autumn.

Speaker 2: – Let's ask our school experts how Americans celebrate Thanksgiving nowadays.

Expert: - Thanksgiving Day is celebrated on the fourth Thursday in November. It is a family holiday. American children like this holiday very much. Many people watch the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade on TV. It is in New York City. It is famous for giant balloons of favourite comics and storybook characters. Workers control the balloons with ropes. Santa Claus arrives at the end. His coming marks the beginning of the Christmas season. They usually watch football on TV in the afternoon. Turkey, corn, pumpkins and cranberries are symbols of Thanksgiving Day.

Turkey jokes

Game "Mr. Turkey"


One pupil sits on the chair. His eyes are closed. Another child knocks on the back of the chair. The pupil on the chair asks, "Who is there?" The child answers: "Mr. Turkey". The pupil must guess who Mr. Turkey is.

Game "Pass the Turkey"

Pass the turkey around the circle as you say:

Painter: - Thanksgiving Day is coming. Turkey is its main symbol. So, I would like to make nice cards with

you. We need paper, markers and gouache. Let's start.

 Paint your thumb and palm brown. Paint the rest of 4 fingers yellow, orange, red and blue.

- Press the hand to the paper.

- Take the red marker and paint a beak. With an orange marker paint turkeys' legs. Finally write: "Happy Thanksgiving Day!"



Speaker 2: – The turkey is a popular bird in North America. In fact, Benjamin Franklin wanted to make the wild turkey, not the bald eagle, the national bird of the United States.

Speaker 1: – Turkeys spend the night in trees. They have great hearing. They can also see in colour. They have a poor sense of smell, but an excellent sense of taste.

Speaker 2: – Wild turkeys can fly at a speed of about 55 miles per hour over short distances. They are good runners with a speed of about 25 miles per hour. About 280 million turkeys are sold for Thanksgiving celebrations. Turkey is the main dish. It is served with sweet potatoes, cranberry sauce and pumpkin pie.

Teacher: – Now let's check your knowledge and play a quiz-game. Look at the screen.

Find the Thanksgiving words on the grid. They can be horizontal or vertical. (*Slide 22*)¹.

Teacher: – On Thanksgiving Day people go around the table and say what they are thankful for. We have cut large 4s from paper. You can write things you are thankful for on our cut outs.

<u>Teacher:</u> – I'll give you the cards with written letters on them. Make up a word THANKSGIVING from these letters and write the Acrostic using vocabulary you have learnt




